Details of the Evaluation System

There are two types of the evaluation system is in place in this institute.

1. University level

a) MD/MS

The university conducts two examinations: the annual examination at the end of the first year and final examination after completion of the next two years. The student is promoted to the final year irrespective of the outcome of the examination of the first year; however, the candidate has to appear in supplementary exams conducted by the university after six months of the first year annual exams. After successful completion of two years in final, the candidate appears in final exams. The successful candidates are awarded a PG degree in the concerned subject. The university has the provision of supplementary examination for candidates failed in the first and final year. The entire evaluation system of MD/MS courses is given below in the tabular form.

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b) PhD

The university will conduct Pre PhD examination after successful submission and acceptance of two half yearly reports within one year after provisional registration by the candidate into PhD programme. Qualifying Pre-PhD is must for registration into PhD programme. The Final Synopsis submission prior to submission of thesis based on research work will be permitted by the university after completion of 3 years (regular) and 5 years (part timers) with successful submission and acceptance of six / ten half yearly reports. The entire evaluation system of the PhD course is given below in the tabular form:
